Meet Our <u>Three</u> New Members

Bob Eckert

Our new member, Bob Eckert, is a long-time stamp and rare coin dealer. He grew up in and then stayed in the Levittown area.

His interest in collecting began about 1959 when he was 6 years old, and his grandfather, a coin collector, gave him a *Whitman Coin Book* and a bucket of pennies. He was told he could have any single different coin from the bucket. That started him collecting coins and soon he was also collecting stamps. His focus went back and forth between coins and stamps for years. About 1975 or '76 he ran a stamp and coin store part time. By 1999 he opened another store full time. Meanwhile, Bob worked in advertising and later he worked for a printer.

Bob mostly collects stamps now: everything US and Israel. He likes going to stamp shows and auction houses, buying, and selling. Stamps consume a lot of his waking hours. Bob hopes to gain knowledge of the Washington Franklin series.

Bob has enjoyed traveling the United States, and he has been in 47 of the 48 contiguous states.



Paul Miller

Paul Miller grew up in NE Philadelphia and now lives in lower Bucks Co. He started stamp collecting as a child and has been an APS member most of his life. After college he did not have time to work on stamps because other things took his time, but he always wanted to get back to it.

His interest revived when he went through his old collections and attended the World Stamp Show-NY 2016. Paul continues attending large stamp shows to find material and likes the relationships that he established with the dealers, some of whom he has known since those early years.

Paul collects all US stamps starting with US #1 and going up. He especially enjoys his lighthouse collection albums.

Paul works for Cardone Industries which makes remanufactured auto parts.

Harris Rabinovich

Harris Rabinovich grew up in the Washington, D.C., but has lived in the Philadelphia area for over 30 years. He is a retired child psychologist who taught at Jefferson and did research on medications.

His interest in stamps grew from the time that he was seven years old and an aunt gave him his first stamps. From then on, he bought stamps from local stamp store and dealers in downtown Washington. He would also read the stamp column in the *New York Times* and buy from the dealers who advertised there. Like many others, he put aside stamps at some point in high school as he focused on studies, then college, med school and career, resuming his interest years later.

Harris collects mint and canceled stamps from British North America, British Asia, Canada, the French Colonies, the US and US Possessions. One of the more unusual pieces in his collection is a postcard featuring early flight in Willow Grove. Harris sent a picture of his postcard to *The American Philatelist* after an article was published about flight on stamps. The picture of his postcard then appeared in the Letters to the Editor column after which someone contacted him wanting to buy the postcard!

For his collecting needs, Harris has attended some of the larger stamp shows in the greater area, but mostly attends local shows like the Merchantville Stamp Club Saturday Bourses.
