## **Program:** The Pictorial Stamps of Tasmania 1899 By Ronald Hill, member TPS Tasmanian Philatelic Society

The Dutch explorer Abel Tasman was the first European to land on the shores of Tasmania in 1642. Tasman named the island to honor Anthony van Dieman, the Governor-General of the Dutch East Indies. In 1803, the island was colonized by the British as a Penal Colony. In 1836 the colony was granted self-government and the name of the island and colony was officially changed to Tasmania on January 1 1856

J.W. Beattie, a well know photographer, was selected to illustrate the beauty of Tasmania in a new series of self-mailing Letter Cards. In 1899 Tasmanian Post authorized a series of eight pictorial stamps showing the beauty of the island.

In 1900 all 8 stamp values were printed and delivered to Hobart. All but one of the stamps featured Beattie photographs. On January 1, 1901 the British Parliament encouraged by Queen Victoria, formed the new Australia Federation making each of the individual colonies new States of the Federation. This program will show details of the photography, of both the Letter Cards and all eight of the Pictorial Stamps as well as variations and other details.

#### **Awards and Honors**

Bob Rufe, co-author with Greg Ajamian and Harry Brittain, received the 2021 Hopkinson Memorial Literature Award from the United States Stamp Society. The award goes to an author(s) for the best article or series in the 2021 issues of the society's journal *The United States Specialist*. The honor recognizes the achievement of the authors in the 6-part series "Scott #C23c – The Whole Story."

At the Rockford (Illinois) Stamp Expo in February, Bill Schultz won a gold and the grand award with his "Dining Cars – Epicurean Pleasure on the Rails." At the London 2022 FIP show in February, Mark Schwartz received a gold for his "The Postal History of Salem, Massachusetts."

Mark Schwartz won the Erani R. Drossos award for the first runner up to the best article in the 2021 American Philatelic Congress Book, with his article "Carrier Service in Boston."

The U.S. Postal Service has recently announced new postage rates which will began on Sunday, January 9, 2022. Priority rates, International Priority rates and first-class package rates will be the only rates that are increasing. There is **NO** rate increase for First Class Mail letters, large envelopes, or postcards until July 2022.

We will be able to use our DVDs on the equipment when we meet live at the Giant. He consulted with the APS and reported that we can stream APS videos for just \$5 each. We all agreed that this was very affordable for the Club.

**February Program:** Barry Elkins presented a wonderful program, *Independent Post Offices of Philadelphia County*. Discussion followed. Since we saw only about one third of his collection of these slides, we may see more of this program at a future date.

Show & Tell & Discuss: Kenneth Miller commented that he was disappointed that there apparently will not be a bi-centenary stamp honoring Ulysses S. Grant this spring, since Kenneth has a Civil War Philately collection. However, he was pleased to report that the 10<sup>th</sup> stamp to be issued in the Music Icons series will be one honoring Pete Seeger.

Future Meetings: Our March meeting should be a live meeting at Giant. It was questioned why we decided to alternate live meetings with Zoom meetings these past five months.
