# Minutes from our June 15th Zoom Meeting

VP Phil Russell opened the Zoom meeting with nine members present and two visitors. Our visitors were Ernie Jones, a collector from FL and Macario Sarreal, a member of the Merchantville Stamp Club. Both were invited to join us by our treasurer, Bruce Marsden.

Letty reminded the group that in past years we have not had meetings in July, nor have we put out a newsletter for July due to summer vacations and therefore low attendance. The consensus of the group was that we would stick to that same schedule this year and resume regular meetings in Aug.

Secretary's Report: There was nothing new to report about the membership.


<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> There have been no expenses or income since the last meeting, so our balance remains the same.

Old Business: Last month members expressed an interest in resuming some face-to-face meetings in the future at our former location. Letty contacted the Giant Super Market earlier in June to see if the Community Rooms were open for use yet. After some delay, the Community Center Coordinator did get back to her with updated information and the limitations. The small Community Rooms are now available but limited to twelve people. Also, masks are mandatory if people are **NOT fully vaccinated.** We can work within these limitations.

Discussion followed about having our Aug. meeting by Zoom and our Sept. meeting at the Giant. We may experiment with combining a live meeting together with Zooming at the same time. Delaying our first face-to-face meeting will give us time to experiment with the technology involved.

New Business: Letty read a letter that the Club received from a collector who would like to donate his WW collection to a club but would like someone to pick it up from his home in Center City Phila. Our members were asked for direction on this matter. It was pointed out that we need to talk with the donor to evaluate the collection size, quality, and condition before we proceed. Bruce Marsden volunteered to contact the donor, and possibly arrange to get the collection to us if we would want it. We can decide at a later time what to do with the collection. We might be able to preview the collection at a live meeting at the Giant, or have an auction by Zoom, which we have not been allowed to do at the Giant facility.

<u>Program:</u> Tom Geiger presented a very good program entitled, "Ben Franklin 1902 – Part Two – The Private Perforation Story", using many examples from his own collection.



Honors and Awards: Bill Schultz received the American Philatelic Society's Ernest Kehr award at the Great American Stamp Show in Rosemont, Ill., in August. The award is bestowed annually upon an individual for enduring contributions that help to guarantee the future of the hobby.

Bill Schultz was also interviewed about stamp collecting in July on closed circuit television at Hershey's Mill in West Chester. Bill is a director of the American Association of Philatelic Exhibitors, where he also serves as Mentor Center Manager. In that role he provides a member service for newer exhibitors, matching them with an experienced exhibitor or judge who can provide support and advice in the early stages of an exhibit before they are ready for the critique service. It can also be for experienced exhibitors who are trying a new type of exhibit they have never done before.



In a Zoom presentation in July for the Philatelic Society of Lancaster County, Mark Schwartz discussed his single frame exhibit of the 1847 issues used in Boston.

At the WESTPEX show in San Francisco in July, Bruce Marsden received a large vermeil and the Women Exhibitors sterling achievement award with his "Switzerland." He also won a large silver for "Switzerland 1932 Disarmament Series Airmail Uses."

At the same show Alan Warren took a gold and the Nepal and Tibet Philatelic Study Circle's Best Himalayan Award for his "Tibet: Stamps and Postal History."
