## Minutes from our April 20th Zoom Meeting

#### Results from PIPEX

Congratulations to Mark Schwartz for receiving a Gold Medal for his exhibit on the 5-cent Virginia Dare Stamp of 1937 – a "Traditional" First Day Exhibit. It included preproduction, first day cachets, and postal use materials. Bruce Marsden received a Vermeil Medal for his Swiss Fondue – Switzerland through Philately exhibit. It was a thematic exhibit which used a variety of philatelic elements to tell the story of Switzerland as an independent nation and global diplomatic center.

## Records from the Philadelphia Stamp Club

Early records of the Philadelphia Stamp Club, a component of the Greater Philadelphia Stamp and Collectors Club, have been turned over to the American Philatelic Research Library. The Club dates to the early 1900s and included such philatelic luminaries as Percy McGraw Mann and Eugene Klein. I inherited these files when I was secretary of the Collectors Club of Philadelphia.
